Where should our research priorities lie? Using stakeholder engagement to inform the future of tobacco control


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About the project

Addressing inequalities Survey ranking: * For top questions under each category,






- Identify and prioritise areas where further research is needed in




To identify CTAG specific research goals within the outcomes of our first goal.

Methods

- We asked our stakeholders incl. SRNT 2016 delegates to tell us which questions they would still like to see answered by
- The findings of survey 1 were fed back to respondents who were asked to prioritise the research categories & the questions within
- 43 of our stakeholders attended a 1-day workshop where they discussed their priorities for tobacco research and suggestions
